THE REGULAR MEETING OF MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF BUENA WAS HELD MONDAY, JULY 12, 2021 COMMENCING AT 701 P.M. VIA TELECONFERENCING WITH MAYOR ZAPPARIELLO PRESIDING. MAYOR ZAPPARIELLO CALLED FOR A MOMENT OF SILENCE FOR THOSE AFFECTED BY COVID-19 AND ANNOUNCED THAT THIS MEETING WAS BEING HELD IN COMPLIANCE WITH THE OPEN PUBLIC MEETINGS ACT AND NOTICES OF THIS MEETING HAVE BEEN PROVIDED, VIA EMAIL, TO THE PRESS OF ATLANTIC CITY, THE DAILY JOURNAL AND THE ATLANTIC COUNTY RECORD ON DECEMBER 1, 2020 AS WELL AS BEING POSTED ON THE BULLETIN BOARD IN BOROUGH HALL.

#### MAYOR'S REPORT: First order of business.

Engineer Robert Smith reported that he is waiting for an update from the Department of Transportation regarding various drainage issues. Mr. Smith sent a follow-up email requesting a status update and is waiting for a response.

## PUBLIC PORTION OF THE MEETING:

Brian Fatcher of Kimberly Lane asked for an update on the roadwork punchlist for potholes and other issues on Central Avenue. Road Supervisor Nimohay responded that the county had contacted the Superfund Site, and bids will be received to repair the potholes. The county will also resolve the balance of issues shortly.

Mr. Fatcher questioned the estimated third-quarter tax bill he received in the mail. Mayor Zappariello stated that tax bills are delayed because the county has not adopted its budget.

Susan Romeo of Landisville asked when the Borough will resume in-person council meetings and open the municipal building. Mayor Zappariello responded that in-person meetings will likely resume in September. The mayor cited the Delta variant of the coronavirus and low vaccination rate (46%) of borough residents. The mayor further stated that the municipal building is staffed and if a resident wishes to conduct business, knock on the door, and they will be let in.

Regarding the Landisville Volunteer Fire Company, Ms. Romeo urged the governing body to avoid delaying the company's reopening and rescind dissolution proceedings since the department abated all violations. Ms. Romeo disputed the

savings that property owners would realize with the proposed expansion and estimated the monthly savings to be \$1.25 per month for Landisville and \$9.46 for Minotola taxpayers. Ms. Romeo also urged caution since there may not be enough line officers and volunteers, which will result in the Borough paying for these services in the future.

Regarding the Landisville Volunteer Fire Company, Betty Testa of Landisville referenced Minotola Fire company budget, debt, and frozen LOSAP account. Ms. Testa urged the governing body to make the proper choice for the community according to the peoples' will. Ms. Testa again requested permission to hold a fundraiser to benefit both Landisville and Minotola Fire companies.

Loretta Gazzara, District 1 Fire Commissioner and Landisville resident referenced a letter sent by Solicitor Costigan requesting additional documentation. Ms. Gazzara stated that the required documentation was submitted by the deadline to have the suspension lifted at tonight's meeting. Solicitor Costigan responded that two items were missing: Firefighter 1 certification for Charles Gazzara and Incident Management certification for Lieutenant Leonard Smith. Solicitor Costigan stated that, upon receipt, the governing body would review and make the appropriate decision. Susan Romeo questioned why the governing body would hold up the reopening of District 1 for two items. Ms. Romeo also asked if the two members mentioned should have received a Rice Notice. Solicitor Costigan responded that the firefighters are not employees and therefore not subject to the requirements.

Charles Gazzara stated he completed Fire Fighter 1 training in 1972 and has undertaken numerous training classes since then. The subsequent training could not occur without Fire Fighter 1 certification. Mr. Gazzara's stated his certificate is not in his file and he has reached out to the state for a copy. Mr. Gazzara referenced similar issues with Minotola Volunteer Fire company members and questioned the apparent disparate treatment.

Bruno Romeo of Landisville questioned the motives of the governing body, stating he is frustrated because the elected officials appear to be stalling in an effort to shut down District 1.

Consultant Steve Kemery stated that Fire Fighter Gazzara had been removed from the active roles pending receipt of the certification document from the state. Mr. Kemery also noted that the Borough has in its possession all prerequisites Lt. Smith needs to receive his Incident Management certificate. Application has been made to the state; however, The Division of Fire Safety is experiencing a backlog in issuing paperwork.

Brian Rowan of Vineland stated that District 1's inability to provide paperwork is an ongoing issue.
