- A public hearing was held at Borough Hall Thursday, March 21 regarding demolition of the old Maurelli building on Central Ave in Minotola. Assistant Solicitor Alan Giebner is taking the necessary steps to complete this task.
- A meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, April 2 at Borough Hall with Atlantic County officials regarding the flooding issues on Summer Ave and Brewster Road which will include a local resident in anticipation of providing possible solutions.
- Road Supervisor Bill Nimohay and Mayor observed parts of the Borough on Saturday during the rain storm and made notations on a variety of areas. Mr. Nimohay and the Mayor have been working closely with the County and State officials to develop a plan.

**WHEREAS**, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A: 4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget up to 2.5% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

**WHEREAS,** N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Borough Council of the Borough of Buena in the County of Atlantic finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2024 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Borough Council hereby determines that a 1.0% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$31,515.29 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

**WHEREAS** the Borough Council hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED**, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Buena, in the County of Atlantic, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2024 budget year, the final appropriations of the Borough of Buena shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased by 3.5 %, amounting to \$110,303.52, and that the CY 2024 municipal budget for the Borough of Buena be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

WHEREAS, in November 2020, a State Referendum was voted upon by the residents of the State of New Jersey to ascertain public opinion on adult use cannabis which reflected that 67% of the voting population is in favor of the legalization of adult use cannabis in the State and as a result, the State Legislation adopted the New Jersey Cannabis Regulatory Enforcement Assistance and Marketplace Act (CREAMM) N.J.S.A. 24:6I-31, et seq: which establishes the authority by which municipalities may regulate the sale and use of adult use cannabis; and

**WHEREAS,** N.J.S.A. 24:6I-45 authorizes municipalities to adopt legislation governing the number and types of cannabis businesses as established under CREAMM and further required municipalities not wishing to accept cannabis businesses to adopt such legislation on or before August 2021 or such municipalities shall be required to allow all types of licenses; and

**WHEREAS**, Buena Borough did not adopt such legislation within the time set forth in N.J.S.A. 24:6I-45 and therefore all classes of cannabis businesses are permitted within the Borough and the Borough adopted Ordinance 705, as amended, to set forth the process for the issuance of local licenses for cannabis businesses; and

WHEREAS, Council required as part of the Final Authorization process, all approved applicants submit site plans and receive approval from the Buena Borough Land Use Board; and

**WHEREAS**, the Solicitor for the Land Use Board recommended that the time within which an applicant should submit site plans should be increased from 30 to 90 days to allow applicants the necessary time for their professionals to prepare and submit said plans for approval.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the Borough of Buena that Ordinance 705, Chapter 202, Section 202.15C 4(a) be amended as follows:

- 9. Final Authorization. For applicants that have an equitable interest in the property, the Borough may grant final license approval, subject to compliance with all site plan requirements and construction rules and regulations including the issuance of a CO or TCO, if the applicant:
  - (a) Submits site plans for approval for authorization from the Buena Borough Land Use Board within 90 days of receiving conditional authorization and posts necessary escrow funds to appear before the Land Use Board.

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED** that the balance of Ordinance 705, as amended, Chapter 202.15C not amended hereby shall remain in full force and effect.

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED** that any Ordinance or portion thereof inconsistent herewith shall be repealed and void to the extent of such inconsistency.

WHEREAS, on April 9, 2014, the Office of the New Jersey State Comptroller advised all municipalities that the Fair Labor Standards Act (FSLA) does not require executive or administrative employees overtime or compensatory time and that the FLSA defines such executive or administrative employees as those who, among other duties, "regularly directs the work of two or more other employees and who has the authority to make recommendations as to job status of other employees" and further recommended that all municipalities discontinue the practice of paying overtime or compensatory time to such administrative employees without the adoption of an Ordinance allowing such practice to continue; and

WHEREAS, in order to comply with the recommendations of the New Jersey State Comptroller, while being fair to Chief Ciraolo, Borough Council and Chief Ciraolo feel it is necessary to amend the Agreement so as to increase the salary to recognize the added hours the Chief puts forth and further allowing the Chief to "flex" her schedule once adequate staffing is in place to alleviate her necessary extra hours thereby doing away with overtime or compensatory time.

**WHEREAS**, in 2006, Borough Council adopted Resolution 107-06 directing the Land Use Board to undertake a preliminary investigation to determine whether Block 145 lot 8.04 among other contiguous lots met the criteria of an area in need of redevelopment in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A: 12A-5; and

**WHEREAS,** on March 27, 2007 the Buena Borough Land Use Board adopted Resolution 2007-11 wherein the Board found that Lot 8.04 met the criteria set forth in N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-5(c), (e) and (h) as an area in need of redevelopment; and

**WHEREAS**, on April 9, 2007 the Borough Council adopted Resolution 41-07 directing the Land Use board create a Redevelopment Plan and recommended the adoption of an Ordinance adopting the Redevelopment Plan for the Commerce Center Redevelopment Area prepared by Remington, Vernick and Walberg, licensed Professional Planners, dated May, 2007 (Plan); and

**WHEREAS**, on July 5, 2007 the State of New Jersey Department of Community Affairs, Office of Smart Growth approved Lot 8.04 as an area in need of redevelopment; and

**WHEREAS**, on May 27, 2008, Borough Council adopted Ordinance 559 an Ordinance adopting the Commerce Center Redevelopment Plan consistent with Resolution 2008-6 of the Land Use Board; and

**WHEREAS**, at Section XII of the Plan adopted by Borough Council is to be "in effect for a period of ten (10) years from the date of adoption by the Borough Council...Nothing herein shall be construed to limit the ability of the Governing Body to extend the duration of this Redevelopment Plan...upon the adoption of an Ordinance authorizing same; and

**WHEREAS**, as the Redevelopment Plan end date, without any extension, was May 27, 2018 and Council finds it to be in the best interest of the Borough for a subsequent investigation take place by the Buena Borough Land Use Board consistent with N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-5 to determine if the reasons set forth for the adoption of Ordinance 559 or such other criteria remain

and to confirm that the Redevelopment Plan for the Commerce Center Redevelopment Area is consistent with the Buena Borough master Plan and to provide recommendations regarding the adoption of an Ordinance extending the duration of the Redevelopment Plan.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Council of the Borough of Buena as follows:

- 1. The Buena Borough Land Use Board shall and the same is hereby authorized and directed to conduct hearings and investigations as required to determine whether the area designated as Block 145 Lot 8.04, continues to meet the criteria as an area in need of redevelopment as defined by N.J.S.A. 12A-1, et seq. Said hearings shall be in accordance with the requirements as a Non-Condemnation Redevelopment Area.
- 2. Upon completion of such hearings and investigations, the Planning Board shall make recommendations and report to the Borough Council for approval regarding the area continuing to be considered a redevelopment area as defined in N.J.S.A. 12A-1, et seq.
- 3. The Land Use Board shall consider the Redevelopment Plan for the Commerce Center Redevelopment Area prepared by Remington, Vernick and Walberg dated May 2007 and provide comment as to the consistency of the Redevelopment Plan with the Buena Borough Master Plan and recommendations regarding the extension of the redevelopment Plan for an additional period of time for the proper redevelopment of the Redevelopment Area.
